Lesson 2 - Business Idioms: "Talking about financial issues"

Mike and John work in the finance department. They need to discuss the financial projections for a new product line.

- A: I'm really excited about the launch of our new product.
- B: Me, too. But before we go any further, we'd better double check and see if this product is going to be profitable.
- A: Good idea.
- B: Actually, yesterday I did some back-of-the-envelope calculations.
- A: Really?
- B: That's right. Here, take a look.
- A: Hmm....this looks good. However, where did you get this figure?
- B: Oh that....well, that figure is an **educated guess** based on last year's results.
- A: I see.....I think you need to double check that again.
- B: Really, What for?
- A: From my experience, using past figures can sometimes get us in hot water.
- B: Okay, I get it. No problem. I'll check with our vendor and get a price quote right away.
- A: Well....let me ask you a question.
- B: Okay....shoot.
- A: Do you have sense for market demand?
- B: What do you mean?
- A: I mean.....We need to ask our Budget Team for business forecasts before we crunch the numbers.
- B: Actually, I already did.
- A: You did?
- B: Yes, that's right. However, the Budget Team said the forecasts are going to be ready next week.

- A: It just **blows my mind** that the Budget Team thinks we can **run numbers** before they give us any figures!
- B: I agree. If we go in the red, it's going to be our heads on the chopping block, not the Budget Team!
- A: That's right. Our boss won't give this project the green light until he sees all of the numbers.
- B: That's a good point.
- A: And...if it doesn't look like our company will at least **break even** or make any money, then,
- B: Then, what....?
- A: Our boss might **pull the plug** on our new product.

Key idioms:

1. back-of-the-envelope calculations.

Definition: informal or casual calculations on a piece of paper

2. educated guess

Definition: a guess based on experience

3. in hot water

Definition: in trouble

4. (to) crunch the numbers

Definition: to perform financial calculations

5. blows my mind

Definition: surprises me/amazes me/bothers me

6. in the red

Definition: lose money

7. run (the) numbers

Definition: to perform financial calculations

8. head on the chopping block

Definition: to have the possibility to be fired or get in big trouble

9. give the green light

Definition: to give the approval or the go sign

10. break even

Definition: to not make a profit or loss

11. pull the plug

Definition: to stop something from continuing/to discontinue a project
