ANALYZE: Let's look at some "simulation conversations."

Simulation 1: Topic: Yokohama

- A: What's your take on Yokohama?
- B: My take is there are many interesting places in <u>Yokohama</u>. In addition, <u>Yokohama</u> has many good restaurants simply because Yokohama is an international city.
 For example, there are a lot of good restaurants in China Town. That's my take.
 What do you think about <u>Yokohama</u>?
- **A**: From my point of view, **Yokohama**....

Simulation 2: Topic: Our company

- B: What do you think about our company?
- **A**: **From my perspective**, **our company** is good **primarily because** we have a wide variety of audio and visual products. **For instance**, our headphones and speakers are very popular. **That's my opinion**. **What do you think about <u>our company</u>?**
- B: The way I see it, <u>our company</u>....

Simulation 3: Topic: Our Current Situation

- A: What's your opinion regarding our current situation?
- **B**: I tend to believe <u>our current situation</u> is very serious for the very fact that this year we found many problems at our Vietnam factory. Case in point, last week we found five quality control problems. That's my opinion. What do you think about <u>our current situation</u>?
- A: From my viewpoint, our current situation.....

Key Phrases to expand your English

"BUSINESS REASON" Phrases:

Basic type: "because"

→ Business REASON Types:

- 1. simply because
- 2. mainly because
- 3. primarily because
- 4. for the very fact that (→ means "because")
- 5. for the simple fact that (→ means "because")

3 "COUNTER" Phrases:

Question: What if **you don't understand** what the speaker is saying?

- 1. If you want your partner to **REPEAT**, say:
- "Excuse me, could you repeat that, please?"
- NG: What? Huh? Eh? Hai?
- 2. If you want your partner to **speak more SLOWLY** say:
- "Excuse me, could you speak a little slower, please?"
- 3. If you DON'T UNDERSTAND, say:
- "Excuse me, what doesmean?" Ex. Excuse me, what does "proposal" mean?
