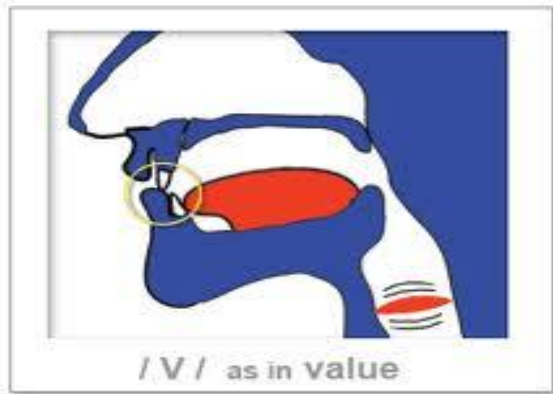

  - 1. **Clear** (Pronunciation & Intonation)
  - 2. **Confident** (Good voice tone)
  - 3. **Logical** (Organized and easy to understand)

## TASK:

- Examples: **improve speaking skills, improve listening skills, expand vocabulary, improve pronunciation skills, etc.**

→ Now add a “Talking about yourself phrase” and a “STARTING phrase’ to your data:

## EXAMPLE:

- **In my case, for starters, I need to improve** my listening skills. **The main reason is** I can’t hear native speaker English. **Case in point**, last week, I couldn’t understand Brendon-san’s English in the teleconference.
- **In addition**, I have to improve....(Target #2)
- **Furthermore**, I need to ....(Target #3)
- Ending: **These are my targets for Term 2.**
