- 4. Would it be possible to test the software again?
- 5. Would it be possible to improve the response time?
- 6. Would it be possible to send the part back to our factory?

Question: Would it be possible to?

- "Yes" Cases
- 1. Sure.
- 2. Yes. It's possible.
- 3. No problem.
- 4. Of course.
- 5. Not a problem.
- 6. No sweat. (Means: "No problem.")

- "No" Cases
- 1. Not possible.
- 2. I'm afraid not.
- 3. No can do.
- 4. Unfortunately, it's not possible due to.....

- You: Good question. Let me explain our plan. Our plan is we will change the testing process.
- First, we will analyze the current schedule.
- Then, we are going to contact our vendor and create a new schedule.
- Finally, we plan to conduct several tests at Shirakawa and Vietnam.
- That's our current plan.
