#### **REVIEW:**

# For Presenters: When you don't know the answer:

Key Pattern: "I'm not quite sure, but, my guess is....."

#### **Examples**:

- 1. I'm not quite sure, but, my guess is the price is about 100 US dollars.
- 2. I'm not quite sure, but, my guess is we will finish by the end of next week.
- 3. I'm not quite sure, but my guess is our sales will continue to increase in China.

# **Example "Q and A" Dialogue #3:**

- Member: May I ask you a question?
- · Presenter: Okay.
- Member: Regarding the price of our product, how much is the price of our product in North America?
- Presenter: Good question. I'm not quite sure, but, my guess is the price is about 100 US dollars.
- · Member: I see. Thank you.
- Presenter: Does that answer your question?
- Member: Yes, it does. Thank you.
- Presenter: My pleasure. Any other questions?

### **Summary**

### **Example Script:**

- Good morning. I'd like to draw your attention to this slide.
- This graph illustrates the percentage of sales in China.
- This part represents <u>months</u>.....and.....this part represents <u>sales</u>.
- As you can see, the sales in our products "increased sharply" at the end of last year.
- This was due to the fact that Bluetooth products were very popular worldwide.
- **Hence**, the sales of our Bluetooth headphones also increased.

### **Next**

- Let me draw your attention to this diagram.
- This diagram illustrates the software problems we had last year.
- This part represents <u>number of bugs</u>.....and.....this part represents <u>location</u>.
- As you can see, the software problems in our products "stabilized" in 2012.
- This was due to the fact that our quality control situation improved in Vietnam.
- As a result, we were able to make more products in 2012.

# 3 - Step "Asking Questions Technique" for TWO slides

- Step 1: May I ask you a question?
- Step 2: Regarding your 1<sup>st</sup>/2<sup>nd</sup> (slide/graph/diagram/chart)
  - + I have a question regarding ....(topic)
- Step 3: Asking Questions
- → What/ Where/ When/ Why/ Which/ Who/ How/ Did you....?/ Can you tell me about...?/ What kind of....?/ When do you plan to ....?/ Have you already....?/ How many...? / What do you think about....? / What's your take on ....? / Have you....?/ Is....? / Why.....?/ Is there....?

### **Sample Dialogue:**

- Presenter: Are there any questions?
- Member: Yes. May I ask you a question?
- Presenter: Sure.
- Member: Regarding your 2<sup>nd</sup> chart, I have a question regarding <u>last year's sales</u>.
  How much did our company sell in 2015 in North America?
- Presenter: First of all, last year was a good year for us. Actually, our company increased our sales 10 percent in North America. As a result, we sold over 45 million US dollars in 2015.
- Member: I see. Thank you.
- Presenter: Does that answer your question?
- Member: **Yes, it does**. Thank you.
- Presenter: My pleasure. Any other questions?
