Pronunciation Technique: Brush <u>bottom</u> lip with <u>upper</u> teeth + (lip vibration)

Pronunciation Practice: "S" and "Sh" Sound





Pronunciation Technique for "S": Use your **tongue** to make a **thin** sound.

Similar to: "Sendai" or "Saga" or "Saitama" or "Sapporo"

Pronunciation Technique for "Sh": Blow air out through your <u>teeth</u> to make a strong air sound + lips a little forward.

Similar to: "Shizuoka" or "Shiga" or "Shinagawa" or "Shibuya" or "Shinjuku"
