- Brush bottom lip with upper teeth +
lip vibration sound

"S" and "Sh" Pronunciation Technique



Pronunciation Technique for "S": Use your tongue to make a thin sound.

Similar to: "Sendai" or "Saga" or "Saitama" or "Sapporo"

Pronunciation Technique for "Sh": Blow air out through your teeth to make a strong air sound + lips a little forward.

Similar to: "Shizuoka" or "Shiga" or "Shinagawa" or "Shibuya" or "Shinjuku"

Problem: Sales of your product is low in Japan

Example Simulation Speaking Technique (Script):

Let me explain the situation.
