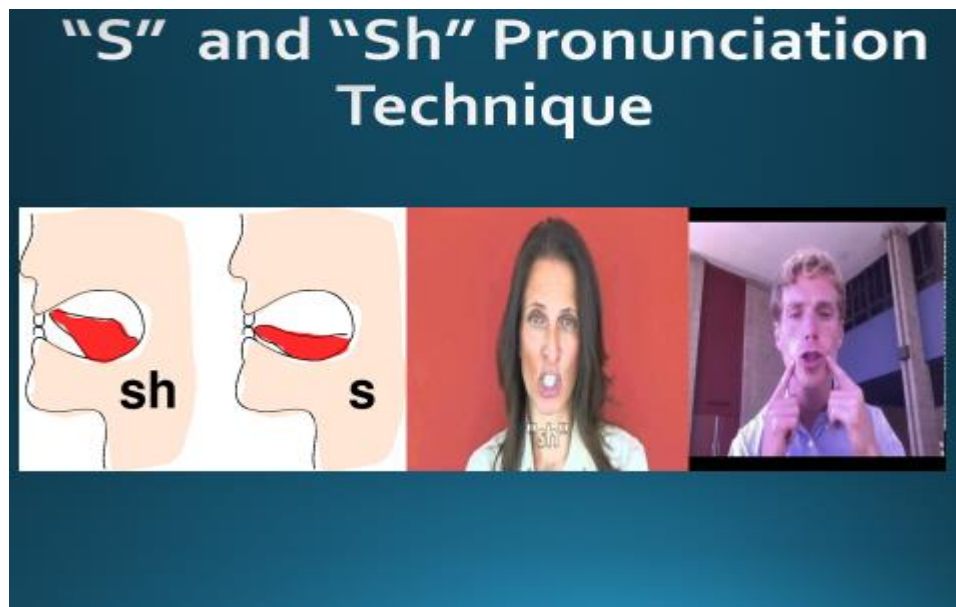

REVIEW: Pronunciation Practice: “S” and “Sh” Sound



Pronunciation Technique for “S”: Use your tongue to make a thin sound.

Similar to: “Sendai” or “Saga” or “Saitama” or “Sapporo”

Pronunciation Technique for “Sh”: Blow air out through your teeth to make a strong air sound + lips a little forward.

Similar to: “Shizuoka” or “Shiga” or “Shinagawa” or “Shibuya” or “Shinjuku”

In business, “expressing concerns” is an important skill that is necessary to overcome problems, issues, or situations on a daily basis. Today, we will study how to effectively “express your concerns” whenever you have a situation in your job, work situation, or project.

Asking about Concerns: 5 Common Questions

1. Do you have any concerns at the moment?
2. Are you concerned about anything at the moment?
3. Is there anything that is concerning you at the moment?
4. If possible, could you share any concerns that you may have at the moment?
5. I would like to hear any concerns that you may have.

3 -Step SPEAKING Technique:

Step 1: “Express Number of Concerns”

I have three concerns regarding....

Step 3: “Ending your speaking

Those are the three concerns that I have at the moment.

Let’s look at some examples:

Concern #1: Company Situation

I have three concerns regarding our company situation. My first concern is our products are not so attractive. Many other companies have really stylish products compared to our company. **To add to that, my second concern is** our products are too expensive. In fact, there are many products that are much cheaper and higher quality in the market than our current products. **Finally, my third concern is** many employees have low motivation due to our company situation. As a result, our engineers are not working as quickly as they can compared to last year. **Those are the three concerns that I have at the moment.**

Concern #2: Current Work Situation

Honestly speaking, I have three concerns regarding my current work situation. My first concern is I often work overtime. For example, last month I worked 35 hours overtime in order to finish my project. Consequently, I sometimes work on Saturdays or Sundays. **In addition, my second concern is** we have too many meetings each week. To be honest, many of our section meetings are just for information sharing. So, in my opinion, general information can be sent to everyone by email. **Last but not least, my third concern is** the number of section members have decreased. Therefore, from my perspective, we need more members in our section to finish our project on time. **Those are the three concerns that I have at the moment.**

Concern #3: Project Situation

Actually, I have three concerns regarding our project situation. My first concern is we have not found all of the bugs in the software yet. As a result, we need more time to find all of the bugs. **Additionally, my second concern is** our client is always late to reply back to our emails. To be honest, the communication needs to be improved between our company and our overseas vendors. **Lastly, my third concern is** we need to finalize the specifications before we can launch our product next year. Therefore, the way I see it, there is a chance that we may not launch our product on time. **Those are the three concerns that I have at the moment.**
